






The artwork on display in the foyer was created by Symon Leech of Brambledown Designs



DIRECTOR'S NOTES

My first introduction to Discworld was when Progress performed *Mort* in 1998 and I was cast as Ysabell, the adopted daughter of Death. My husband Aidan had always been a Terry Pratchett fan and had all the books, so it was easy for me to read the novel to gain some background information. I learned that Ysabell loved pink and eating chocolate, and I managed to persuade the director to let me eat chocolate on stage in most of my scenes!

The following year I directed my first large cast play, The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe followed a couple of years later by Charlie and The Chocolate Factory and James and the Giant Peach in 2006. I really enjoyed the challenge of directing large cast plays which included members of Progress Youth Theatre as well as adults, and the creative opportunities offered in bringing these fantastic worlds to life. I have been very fortunate in having Aidan by my side in my creative journey as he has designed amazing sets and props for these large-scale productions which allow the many, often short, scenes to flow together seamlessly.









When directing other, more traditional, plays we're fine with blackouts and stage managers coming on stage with set and props, but for this sort of play we like to use lighting and sound to create the scene changes as far as possible and have the actors execute any physical scene changes so as not to break the flow of the action. In the same way as many actors play more than one role in this type of play, so the scenery has to be capable of portraying different locations with the clever use of lighting and a set that appears simple but has a few surprises in store.

My next large cast plays were A Midsummer
Night's Dream in Reading Abbey Ruins and then
Five Children and It (co-directed with Ali Carroll),
for which Aidan designed a clever set where the
various elements popped up from the floor in the
manner of a pop-up storybook. And then it was
time for my first Pratchett – Going Postal in 2010.
To date that remains the only play I have
directed when I never actually had the whole
cast on stage together until the first night – not
even for the final dress rehearsal! That didn't put
me off however, although the next play I brought
to the stage was John Godber's Teechers –
multiple characters again but only three actors,
so that was a bit of a rest!

But I had been well and truly bitten by the Pratchett bug and went on to direct The Fifth Elephant in 2013 and Maskerade 2018 (and several non-Pratchetts in between, including Noises Off with the most complicated set the Progress stage has ever seen!). Maskerade was the first time I had Nanny Ogg and Granny Weatherwax on stage, brought to life perfectly by Liz Carroll and Melanie Sherwood respectively. I loved the witches so much I wanted to do another play with them so I chose Wyrd Sisters to stage in January 2020. Auditions were open to all, as all Progress auditions are, but no-one else of a certain age auditioned for Nanny and Granny (I still suspect foul play!) so Liz and Mel reprised their roles to the delight of all the Pratchett fans who came to see the show, and Discworld Monthly who declared they had met 'the real Nanny Ogg'.

Liz appears again on stage in this production. I cast her as the Tooth Fairy and the Narrator, but at the first rehearsal she sidled up to me and said 'I want to play Nanny Ogg again, I miss her'.

I have really enjoyed bringing Hogfather to the stage and it has been fantastic to work with such a talented cast, both young and still young-at-heart, including six Youth Theatre members, many familiar faces and several people new to Progress. Casting was particularly difficult with forty-five people auditioning from which we had to choose a cast of twenty.



I would have been happy casting all forty-five as there are at least that many roles but there is no way to fit that many people backstage – even twenty is pushing it!!

And finally I have to say thank you to the wonderful team behind the magic: creating the set, lighting, sound, costumes, props, managing things backstage, promoting the show, helping at rehearsals, creating the programme, chaperoning the youngsters and filling the front of house roles to make sure the theatre can open – I couldn't have done it without you all and I truly appreciate everyone's contributions and hard work.

IT'S IN THE BONES

THE UNIQUE ANCESTRY OF SUSAN STO HELIT

Long ago, Death himself took on a human apprentice, a well-meaning, but rather dimwitted young man called Mortimer, though he preferred to be called Mort. The young man tried his best but had a habit of allowing his curious mind to wonder about the meaning of death. And during his apprenticeship, Death with a capital D, decided to take a sabbatical, leaving Mort to carry the burden of the Duty. While Mort was eager to please, he soon found that he wasn't very well suited to the Duty of ushering souls to the next world, but Mort wasn't alone: someone tagged along to criticize him...

That someone was Ysabell, Death's daughter.
Well – his adoptive daughter. Many years
before Death took on Mort as an apprentice, he
found the infant Ysabell after her parents were
tragically killed and, moved by pity, he raised
her as his own. But after many, many years of
living in Death's domain, Ysabell began to
grow bored. By the time she first met Mort she
had been sixteen years old for the past thirtyfive years.*

After an initial frosty reception, then a long period of despising each other, on top of all the chaos that ensued when Mort failed to reap the soul of a princess, Mort and Ysabell grew to tolerate each other and eventually fell in love.

When the mess that Mort had created was finally set right, Mort and Ysabell married and became the Duke and Duchess of Sto Helit – well, they did save the princess-now-queen of Sto Lat's life. And of course, it helped to having Death as your father-in-law.



Later, Mort and Ysabell had their first and only child, whom they named Susan. But sixteen years after her birth, both parents died in an accident. Up until that point, Susan had no memory of Death being her grandfather, and only makes this discovery because Death, driven by grief at Ysabell's passing, abandoned the Duty to try and forget.**

Susan Sto Helit had to temporarily step into her grandfather's role. She did her best, but she too did not take well to the Duty – like father, like daughter. Although unlike Mort, Susan did not alter causality and upset the flow of time, she merely tried to prevent the untimely death of a musician for whom she developed feelings. She inherited her humanity from her parents, but she also inherited many of the same powers as her grandfather. The power of Death runs in the family. It's in the bones.



SIR TERRY PRATCHETT



Sir Terence David John Pratchett, OBE (28 April 1948 – 12 March 2015), better known as Terry Pratchett, was an English author of fantasy novels, especially comical works. He is best known for his Discworld series of 41 novels. Pratchett's first novel, *The Carpet People*, was published in 1971. The first Discworld novel, *The Colour of Magic*, was published in 1983, after which he wrote two books a year on average. His 2011 Discworld novel *Snuff* was, at the time of its release, the third-fastest-selling hardback adult-readership novel since records began in the UK, selling 55,000 copies in the first three days. His final Discworld novel, *The Shepherd's Crown*, was published in August 2015, five months after his death.

Pratchett, with more than 85 million books sold worldwide in 37 languages, was the UK's best-selling author of the 1990s. He was appointed Officer of the Order of the British Empire (OBE) in 1998 and was knighted for services to literature in the 2009 New Year Honours. In 2001 he won the annual Carnegie Medal for *The Amazing Maurice and his Educated Rodents*, the first Discworld book marketed for children. He received the World Fantasy Award for Life Achievement in 2010.

In December 2007, Pratchett announced that he had been diagnosed with early-onset
Alzheimer's disease. He later made a substantial public donation to the Alzheimer's Research
Trust (now Alzheimer's Research UK), filmed a television programme chronicling his experiences with the disease for the BBC, and also became a patron for Alzheimer's Research UK. Pratchett died on 12 March 2015 aged 66.



The Hon. Sir Geoffrey Bibbleton ~ Gareth Davidson A well-to-do nobleman and friend of the Gaiter Family. He is in attendance at the Gaiter's Hogswatch party.

Bilious ~ Freddie Meader

The O God of Hangovers and the antithesis of Bibulous the God of Wine, who can drink as much as he likes and wake up the next morning as fresh as a daisy because Bilious is the one who gets his hangover. Bilious appears along with the Verruca Gnome and the Eater of Socks due to a void in the collective human belief created by the sudden disappearance of the Hogfather.

Violet Bottler ~ Flora Paulo

When Violet is not working as a tooth fairy for The Tooth Fairy herself, she is an active member of Offler's League of Temperance* - a group which abstains from alcohol, for which she wears a blue ribbon.

Charlie ~ Joseph O'Leary

Charlie is Violet's boss and runs bulk collection and despatch for the tooth fairies. He feels as if he is much put upon and likes to tell people so.

Vernon Crumley ~ Joseph O'Leary

Oh, the joy he feels when people come into his store to spend lots of money, so Mr Crumley always makes sure his store is appropriately festive to get people to come in and spend lots and lots of money. Crumley likes money.



DEATH ~ JAKE TURNELL WILLETT

The anthropomorphic personification of the event that coincides with the end of life, appearing as a 7ft tall skeleton wearing a black hood and wielding a scythe, is Death with a capital D. Yet despite his sinister appearance, Death is rather fond of humans and the way they live their lives. In fact, helping humans and participating in the act of living has become a sort of hobby for him. Death possesses a unique memory and can remember everything that ever was or will be. Death likes cats and also enjoys an occasional curry.



Lord Downey ~ Joseph O'Leary

The Master of the Assassins' Guild, a position he inherited after the death of the former Master, Dr Cruces. A very shrewd businessman and a key political player in Ankh-Morpork society, Lord Downey is an Assassin with a capital 'A', with a penchant for poisons, although no-one has ever been able to connect him to any cases of poisoning. He is allegedly credited with inventing Poison Peppermints (the secret ingredient is arsenic).



Rufus Drumknott ~ Sam Sladden

Hibiscus Dunelm ~ Iesa Khan

As the current landlord of the infamous Mended Drum – Ankh Morpork's oldest Public House – Hibiscus is the latest in a long line of landlords, since the Drum has been knocked down and rebuilt so many times in the city's known history. Due to the pub's sinister reputation, unsavoury clientele and the unfortunate habit it has of attracting natural and man-made calamity, Hibiscus is not likely to last long as proprietor... Time will tell!

Mrs Prudence Gaiter ~ Steph Dewar

An overly ambitious social climber, Mrs Gaiter is always looking to better her family's position and status in Ankh-Morpork society. She has read books on etiquette although is not always sure when a serviette should be called a napkin, but she is sure that every family of the wannabe upper-class should have a governess in their employ.

Twyla Gaiter ~ Flora Alden/Niamh McConalogue Bracewell

The only daughter of Mr and Mrs Gaiter. She has a habit of trying to sound ingratiatingly cute to get her own way. She'd believe in anything if she knew there was a dolly in it for her. She may be young in years but in cynicism she is 35.

Gawain Gaiter ~ Noah Thomas/Callie Wenham

The only son of Mr and Mrs Gaiter. Gawain is a curious child, with an overactive imagination which is prone to bringing monsters and imaginary creatures into existence. Gawain enjoys watching imaginary bears (which appear if you step on a crack in the pavement) get beaten up by his Governess Susan.

Hex ~ Iesa Khan

The University's first (and only) mechanical thinking machine. Built by Ponder Stibbons and the student Wizards from odds and ends and various occult sundries from around the university, it is no surprise that Hex has magically developed its own sentience. If any Wizard has a problem, then Hex knows the answer.



Anaglypta Huggs ~ Sam Sladden

A very respectable folklorist and a choir master of the Ankh-Morpork Wassailers, Anaglypta has assembled the choir to spread Hogswatch cheer and collect donations for the poor – or rather the poor who are suitably picturesque and not too smelly and who can be relied on to say 'thank you'. Anaglypta, always vigilant and slightly prudish, has made sure to censor all the Hogswatch carols and erase any suggestive content.

Lance Constable Salacia Deloresista Amanita Trigestatra Zeldana Malifee... von Humpeding*

A young 51-year-old vampire from Überwald, who works for the Ankh-Morpork City Watch and plays the cello in her spare time.

Banjo Lilywhite ~ Dimitrios Paximadas

Banjo is the younger brother of Medium Dave. A ridiculously strong man capable of lifting two men in each hand by the neck, although he is not fond of violence, Banjo just has a simple mind and always does what he is told like a good boy. Banjo has never had to think for himself: he's had his mother or brother to do his thinking for him.

Dave (Medium Dave) Lilywhite ~ Ali Carroll

A violent thug from the Shades in Ankh-Morpork and the older brother of Banjo - where Banjo is the muscle, Davey is the brain by default. In his own way, Medium Dave has looked out for Banjo ever since the passing of their formidable mother, Ma Lilywhite, whom they loved dearly - and feared even more.

Narrator (Gytha (Nanny) Ogg)** ~ Liz Carroll

Nanny Ogg is a Witch from the Kingdom of Lancre in the Ramtop mountains. She has been married three times, has fifteen children, an army of grandchildren and great grandchildren, and a cluster of indentured daughters-in-law whom she keeps in a constant state of terror. No tyrant in the whole history of the world has ever achieved a dominion so complete. Nanny adheres to the Witches' tradition of not leaving their homes on Hogswatch night, by inviting the whole village into her home to celebrate, with lots of drinking.

Toby Nash ~ Iesa Khan

Toby is a guard entrusted with protecting the Tooth Fairy's Castle. He suffers from a wide variety of nightmares.

Mustrum Ridcully ~ Gareth Davidson

Ridcully is the Archchancellor of the Unseen University, and he is determined to whip those damn lazy Wizards into shape! So far, he has not been very successful, but Ridcully never changes his mind and never gives up. He is very practical for a Wizard and, to the horror of his colleagues, loves the outdoors and nature. He earned the monicker of Ridcully the Brown for his love of endangered animals and for keeping the buggers on the endangered list.

Mr Sideney ~ Sam Sladden

A student Wizard at the Unseen University, who is currently a bit down on his luck due to huge gambling debts. If anyone asks, you haven't seen him. He's incognito.

Ponder Stibbons ~ Steph Dewar

Head of the Inadvisably Applied Magic department as well as Praelector and the Reader in Invisible Writings, making Ponder the youngest member of the faculty at the Unseen University. The other Wizards view him as a bit of a 'know-it-all'.

Susan Sto Helit ~ Megan Turnell Willett

The daughter of the late Duke and Duchess of Sto Helit, and the Granddaughter of Death, Susan is determined to have as much of a normal life as one who can walk through walls, stop time and see what is really there, can. She is burdened with an exceptionally above average level of common sense. Currently she works as a Governess for the Gaiter family.

Jonathan Teatime ~ Dean Stephenson

Pronounced Teh-ah-tim-eh — at least that's the way he likes it and very few care to ask why that is. People tend not to last very long in Mr Teatime's company. He came to join the Assassins' Guild in Ankh-Morpork shortly after the mysterious death of both his parents. He excelled in the Guild of Assassins due to his brilliant, albeit fractured mind. But unlike his fellow colleagues in the Guild, Mr Teatime is not motivated by silly distractions like money — which only gets in the way of a good killing.









The Tooth Fairy ~ Liz Carroll

The Tooth Fairy is an ancient entity and actually started out as the very first Bogeyman way back in the early days. But over time the Tooth Fairy grew to like humans and wanted to protect them instead of scaring them, and to keep everyone safe she started to collect people's missing teeth – you can't just leave them lying about you know. The Toymaker (Henry Whittle) ~ Michael Webber

The Toymaker owned a little toyshop in Ankh-Morpork thousands of years ago when Albert himself was a little boy. He specialised in carving wooden horses.

Arnold Sideways ~ Steph Dewar

A beggar who has the distinct advantage of having no legs. He moves around on a small four wheeled cart. He is a master of causing cerebral confusion.

The Beggars Guild is the wealthiest Guild in the city of Ankh-Morpork – because they don't pay for anything. They have decided to get into the festive spirit and spread some Hogswatch Cheer – they are going to make a fortune.
